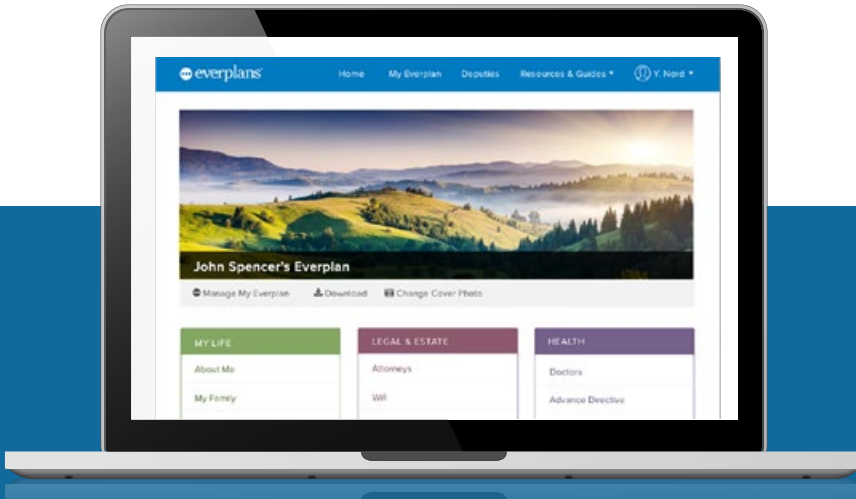
You know about your doctors, specialists, medicines and allergies—but does your family?
