
*Tuesday, April 11<sup>th</sup> in Canfield, OH*



## *Mackinac Island*

Mackinac Island was first settled by the French in 1671. The town started life as a military garrison and the strategic fur trading center of the Great Lakes area. The British established Fort Mackinac during the American Revolution and the area was the sight of two battles during the War of 1812. By the late 19<sup>th</sup> Century, Mackinac Island had shed its role as a garrison becoming a popular summer tourist attraction. A unique feature of Mackinac is transportation is only permitted in three forms: by foot, bike, or horseback.



During our stay, we'll do a horse drawn carriage tour seeing all of Mackinac's most famous sites. To include, The Arch, The Butterfly House, The Fort, The Grand Hotel Stables and Museum. ## *Visiting Stan Hywet*



Frank Seiberling was an American innovator and entrepreneur. He entered the world of industrial manufacturing working in his father's business, the J.F. Seiberling Company. During his tenure, he invented a twine binder that tied grain bundles with a bow knot.

The J.F. Seiberling Company ultimately failed during the Panic of 1896, as a result Frank found himself unemployed. In 1898, he learned of a vacant strawboard factory that was for sale in East Akron. Seiberling borrowed \$3,500 from his brother-in-law as a down payment on the facility, and in partnership with his brother, decided to pursue rubber manufacturing. It was in this factory, that The Goodyear Tire & Rubber Company was formed.

For this event, we'll visit Stan Hywet Hall and Gardens, the Estate of Frank Seiberling. Stan Hywet is a 65 room Tudor Revival Manor House with its original assembly of furnishings and antiques. The hall features 23 fireplaces along with hand-carved paneling of oak, sandalwood, and black walnut. This estate exemplifies the pinnacle of early 20<sup>th</sup> century opulence.

We will depart by bus from the office at 9:00AM, please arrive at the office no later than 8:45AM. We'll enjoy a private tour of the manor and gardens followed by a boxed lunch. After lunch, we'll visit the outer cottage where Alcoholics Anonymous was founded. William McKinley, a native of Niles, OH, served as the 25<sup>th</sup> President of the United States from 1897 to 1901. Overlooked by many, President McKinley was a consequential figure in American History. With his tenure as President occurring at the dawn of the 20<sup>th</sup> Century, he ushered the United States down the path that would inevitably lead to our status as the global hegemon which we enjoy today. Join us, while we visit the William McKinley Presidential Library and Museum in Canton, OH. The museum contains the largest collection of McKinley artifacts in the world.

This event is scheduled for Tuesday, July 11<sup>th</sup>. The bus will depart our office at 8:30AM, please arrive at our office no later than 8:15AM. Upon arrival we'll visit the Will McKinley Presidential Museum and Library followed by a visit to the National First Ladies Library. 


## *Indiana, Amish, and Notre Dame*

The Amish began migrating to North America from Western Germany during the early 18<sup>th</sup> Century, with the first 500 people settling between 1717 and 1750; most of them planting their roots in Berks County, Pennsylvania. Over the last three-hundred years, the Amish have established communities all over the United States. Join us, on our trip to Indiana as we experience Amish culture.

We'll depart from the office for Shipshewana, Indiana on Monday, August 28<sup>th</sup>. During our trip, we'll stay at the Van Buren Hotel, which is perfectly located relative to our planned events. We'll eat dinner that evening at the Blue Gate Restaurant and Theater. Following dinner, we'll enjoy a play called The Home Game. The Home Game is a story about a boy named Levi Troyer and his internal struggle between living an Amish life or perusing his dream as a major league baseball player.

Following breakfast on Tuesday, we'll depart for our event filled day. Our first stop will be at Lambright Country Chimes. Lambright Country Chimes provides a large selection of personalized windchimes. For the rest of the day, we'll tour an array of Amish specialty shops. Dinner will be served at West on Warren Gallery and Grill.

Have you ever wanted a personal tour of the Notre Dame? On Wednesday, we'll experience a 75-minute guided tour of the Notre Dame campus. From there, we'll split into two groups. Group one will tour the Studebaker National Museum followed by the Oliver Mansion. Group two will start at the Oliver Mansion, then tour the Studebaker National Museum. For dinner, you'll have the option to eat with the group or get dinner on your own at Parisi's Restaurant.

After breakfast on Thursday, we'll spend the day touring a host of Amish family-owned businesses, ranging from leather working to basket making. You will have the opportunity to get lunch on your own at Mercantile 37 in Noblesville. After lunch we'll tour Menno-Hof. Menno-Hof will provide us with 25 different venues that explain the culture, faith, and history of the Amish. Following the day's events, we'll head to Yoder's house for a traditional Amish dinner.


Friday's main event will be a tour of the Jayco RV Factory. The tour will start in the Jayco Visitor's Center where we'll learn about their history. Following the visitor's center, we'll board the Jayco Trolley for a birds-eye view of their manufacturing operations. After the tour is complete, we'll depart for the office arriving around 8:30PM.
