Our firm is registered with the Securities and Exchange Commission as an Investment Adviser. It is important for you to understand that brokerage and investment advisory services and fees differ. Free and simple tools are available to research firms and financial professionals at [Investor.gov/CRS](https://investor.gov/CRS), which also provide educational materials about broker-dealers, investment advisers, and investing.

What investment services and advice can you provide me?

We offer investment advisory services to retail investors. Our services include Asset Management and Financial Planning and Consulting. We will meet with you initially to understand your goals and help you determine the portfolio of investments to suit your objectives. We will then offer to meet with you at least annually to review your portfolio. Financial Planning is included in our Asset Management services at no additional cost. Financial Planning is also available as a separate service for a fee in which your investments are not monitored on an ongoing basis.

We manage accounts on a discretionary basis which means we do not need your authorization to make changes in the portfolio. If there are any limitations this will be outlined in the advisory services agreement you sign with our firm. We do not restrict our advice to limited types of investments. The minimum portfolio value is generally set at \$100,000. The minimum annual fee for any portfolio is \$1,250. Our firm will, at its discretion, make exceptions to the foregoing or negotiate special fee arrangements where we deem it appropriate under the circumstances.

What fees will I pay?

You will be charged a quarterly fee based on the value of your accounts. Depending on the value of your accounts the advisory fee will be between .50% and 1.00%. The more assets you have in your advisory account, the more you will pay us. We therefore have an incentive to increase the assets in your advisory account in order to increase our fees. Our fees vary and are negotiable. The amount you pay will depend, for example, on the services you receive and the amount of assets in your account. Our firm's fees will be automatically deducted from your advisory account, which will reduce the value of your advisory account. In rare cases, our firm will agree to send you invoices rather than automatically deduct our firm's fees from your advisory account.

Our Financial Planning & Consulting services fee ranges from \$500 to \$1,500 and hourly fees are negotiated with each client. We charge an upfront retainer when you sign an agreement for this service. The custodian that holds your assets charges you a transaction fee when we buy or sell an investment for you. Their fees are in addition to our firm's fees for our Asset Management service. You may also pay charges imposed by the custodian holding your accounts for certain investments and maintaining your account. Some investments, such as mutual funds, index funds, exchange traded funds, and variable annuities, charge additional fees that will reduce the value of your investments over time.

You will pay fees and costs whether you make or lose money on your investments. Fees and costs will reduce any amount of money you make on your investments over time. Key Questions to Ask Your Financial Professional

- *Help me understand how these fees and costs might affect my investments. If I give you \$10,000 to invest, how much will go to fees and costs, and how much will be invested for me?*

What are your legal obligations to me when acting as my investment adviser? How else does your firm make money and what conflicts of interest do you have?

When we act as your investment adviser, we have to act in your best interest and not put our interest ahead of yours. At the same time, the way we make money creates some conflicts with your interests. You should understand and ask us about these conflicts because they can affect the investment advice we provide you. Here are some examples to help you understand what this means.

Two of our firm's financial professionals are licensed insurance agents who may sell insurance products for a commission. They have an incentive to recommend insurance products to you in order to increase their compensation. However, we will always notify you of any insurance recommendation that will generate a commission for our firm.

SWMG receives compensation through a joint venture agreement with ARG Investment Services, LLC (SEC#801-70888). This agreement is to provide investment advisory and financial planning/consulting services to select clients. Clients who fall under this agreement will sign the ARG / SWMG Joint Consulting and Advisory Services Agreement and shall receive the applicable ADV disclosure documents for each firm. Asset management and financial planning/consulting fees paid by such client will be split between the two firms in the manner laid out in the joint venture agreement.
